This Week's Highlights

In **Nursery** we have focused our learning on the story Jack and the Beanstalk, the children are learning to retell the story, thinking about the order of events. They have also listened to the piece of music "In the Hall of the Mountain King", using the music to re-enact the story, thinking about the movements to make. We have also enjoyed spending time outside and talking about the changes as we head to the season of Spring.

In **Reception**, we began our week investigating who had laid eggs in our classroom. We wrote about what thought may hatch from the egg. We had two ducks visit us on the field and we learnt about dinosaurs. We have also been learning about keeping ourselves safe through the NSPCC approach of 'Pantosaurus'. The children have enjoyed singing the Pantosaurus song. In Maths, we are developing our understanding of numbers up to 10, exploring relationships between numbers including one more and one less.

In **Year 1** we created some wonderful poems with the poet Ian Bland. We loved creating actions to help too! In history, we are learning about nurses from the past, and how they have impacted on health care today. We have been researching different types of vehicles in DT to help us think about which vehicle we would like to design and make this term.

In **Year 2** we enjoyed creating alliteration poems with the poet Ian Bland. It was lots of fun sharing out poems to our class and hearing their feedback. We enjoyed trying different healthy drinks in DT as part of our product research in order to help us create our own in the coming weeks. We have also been working hard on learning all about multiplication in Maths this week.

In **Year 3** we really enjoyed our afternoon on Tuesday with poet Ian Bland. We worked with him to create our own poems, mainly about animals and celebrities! We have had assessment week in school this week and have been really impressing our teachers with our mature attitude towards showcasing our knowledge and skills.

In **Year 4** we came up with some fantastic kennings whilst working with the poet Ian Bland and we had lots of fun in the process! We have continued to work on finding the perimeter of shapes during Maths, and in English we started 'Queen of Darkness'. We are looking forward to finding out more about Boudica next week!

In **Year 5** we have enjoyed going back to swimming this week! We have all been working so hard to gain more confidence in the water learning different strokes and breathing techniques. For Assessment Week, the children have been showing so much resilience – and have really given it their best! In Science, we have been learning about combustions and how removing one part of the fire triangle can put a fire out.

In **Year 6**, we have been busy with assessments and showing everyone just how much we've learned. We had a great time with the poet, Ian Bland and we had the chance to work with him to write our own poems. In PSHE, we've looked at social media versus reality and the children have understood that everything this see on social media isn't a true reflection of that person's life.
