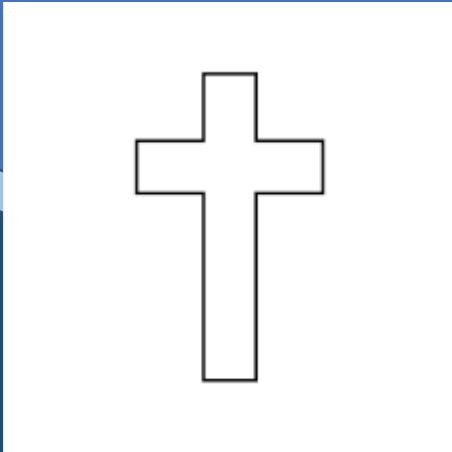


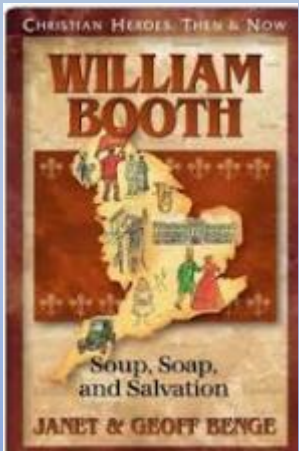

- ✦ A leader is someone who upholds values and sets a good example for others to follow.

- ✦ Christians believe that God cares about his created world and continues to act through people (like these prophets) in order to intervene in human history.

- ✦ Servants to God can be people like Vicars, but also ordinary Christians who like to help others (such as the volunteers at the Salvation Army, or people who run groups such as youth groups).
- ✦ Salvation Army churches have a brass band and praise God through music.

William Booth (10 April 1829 – 20 August 1912) was an English Methodist preacher who, along with his wife, Catherine, founded the Salvation Army and became its first General (1878–1912).



Prophet

Someone who has contact with a divine being (God).

Servant to God

Someone who carries out God's work.

Leader

Someone who upholds values and sets a good example for others to follow.

The Salvation Army

A Christian organisation who help others in need.

General

The international leader of The Salvation Army

Volunteer

A person who willingly gives their time to help others.

Vocation

A strong feeling of suitability. Volunteers at organisations such as the Salvation Army often talk about it being a 'vocation'.

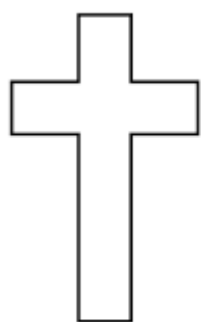

- ✦ World Vision and Christian Aid are two charities that help people in poverty in the UK and overseas.
- ✦ World Vision and Christian Aid help other people to because Jesus helped people in need.

Discipleship

Someone who follows Jesus because they want to be like him.

Disciple

A person whole followed Jesus when he was alive

A characteristic displayed by a person (e.g. kindness)

The beliefs and qualities that you believe are important in the way that you live

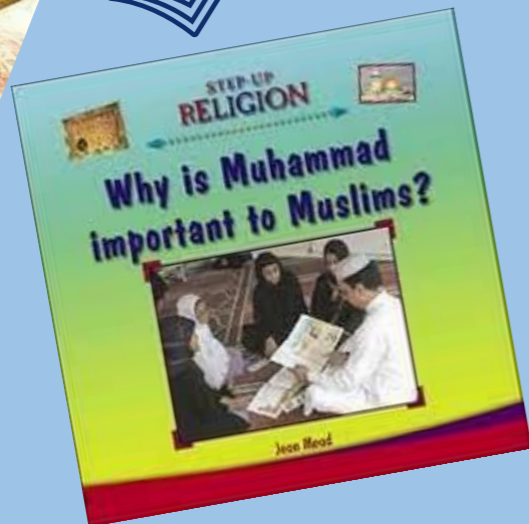

Aspirational People

Since being founded in 2000, Islamic Aid has raised over £75million. They seek a world where poverty and suffering have been overcome and people live in dignity, independence and freedom.

- Islam is the world's second largest religion.
- It is believed that Muhammad was the last of Allah's prophets and the one who delivered his final message.
- Allah delivered messages to Muhammad over 22 years, and these messages were written down as the Qur'an.
- Zakat is one of the 5 pillars of Islam.
- Every year, Muslims give up a share of their savings to help those in need, for example, refugees escaping violence in their country and people who live in poverty.
- During the month of Ramadan, all adult Muslims who have food to spare, donate this food to the needy.
- Charities, such as Islamic Aid and Muslim Aid, were founded to help Muslim communities in need.

Zakat

The compulsory giving of a set proportion of a persons wealth to charity

5 Pillars of Islam

Religious duties that provide a framework for a Muslim's life

PBUH

Peace be upon him – a phrase used in Islamic practice to show respect

Prophet Muhammad

An Arab religious, social, and political leader and the founder of Islam

Qur'an

The central religious text of Islam, believed by Muslims to be a revelation from God

Guidance

Advice or information aimed at resolving a problem given by someone in authority

Charity

An organisation set up to provide help and raise money for those in need

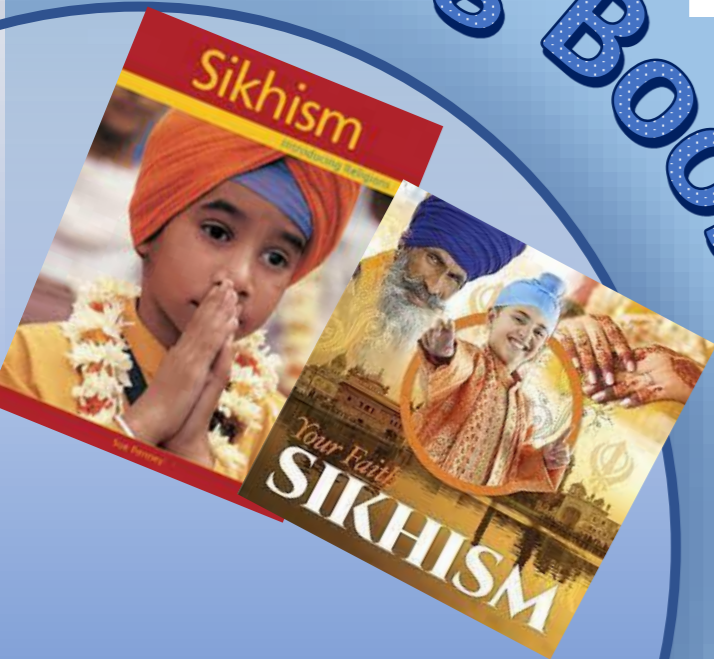

- Sikhs believe in one God.
- Guru Nanak was the first Sikh Guru.
- Guru Nanak shared God's message that he made everything and sees everyone as equal.
- There were ten human Sikh Gurus.
- The Guru Granth Sahib is the eleventh and final guru. It is treated as a living guru.
- Vaisakhi is celebrated in April every year to remember the start of the Khalsa and the beloved 5.
- Joining the Khalsa is a sign of commitment in Sikhism.
