- The 5 Ks are Kanga, Kesh, Kara, Kirpan and Kacchera.
- The 5Ks are worn by members of the Sikh Khalsa.
- Langar is a free kitchen in a Gurdwara where everyone can go for food.
- Khalsa Aid International is UK charity that helps victims of disasters (earthquakes, floods. War around the world)

The 5 Ks

Symbols worn by Sikhs who are a part of the Khalsa.

Kanga

Comb worn in the hair.

Kesh

Uncut hair.

Kara

Bangle made from iron or steel.

Kirpan

Sword worn under the clothes.

Kachhera

Shorts worn under clothes.

Khanda

The Sikh religious symbol.

Sewa

Helping others without any personal reward or gain.
