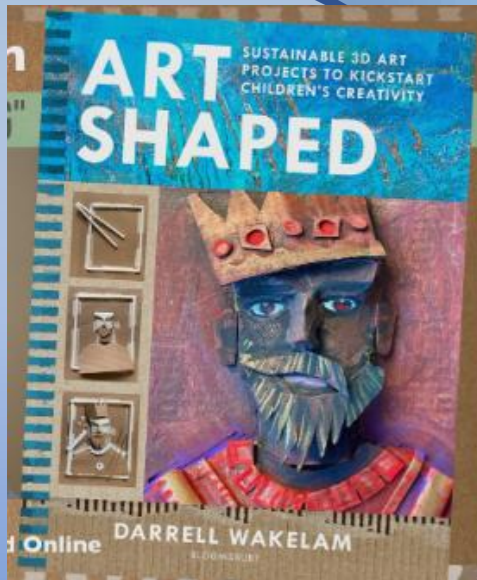

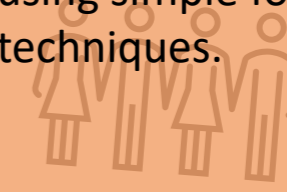


- Darrell is a sculpture artist. He trained as an illustrator but gradually over time he became more and more interested in sculptural work.
- His work is predominantly three dimensional (3D)
- Darrell's work incorporates cheap, everyday materials, mainly scrap cardboard.
- You can manipulate cardboard using different techniques such as zip cutting, scoring, slits and strips to make a 3D structure.
- I can strengthen and depth my cardboard structure by using brown paper and PVA glue.
- I can use brown paper (or tissue paper in more detailed areas) and depth to my sculpture.
- A technique called sponge painting can be used to add texture to a surface eg: scales, fur

3D- Three Dimensional : 3D, or three dimensional, refers to the three spatial dimensions of width, height and depth. The physical world and everything that is observed in it are three dimensional.

Scoring- scratching to help card to bend

Sculpture- the art of making three-dimensional representative or abstract forms.

Depth - depth refers to the perceived distance between the background and the foreground of a composition

Medium - A medium in the art world is the term for the material used to create artwork. Mediums can include paint or inks, sculpting materials, fabric, glass, and even sound or living people in some cases. The medium that an artist chooses to work with contributes to both the style of the art and its meaning.

Slits - a long, narrow cut or opening.
Reinforced - to strengthen or support (an object or substance), especially with additional material.

Tertiary - a combination of primary and secondary colours

Sponge Painting - a coating application technique that gives an interesting texture and appearance to a surface.
