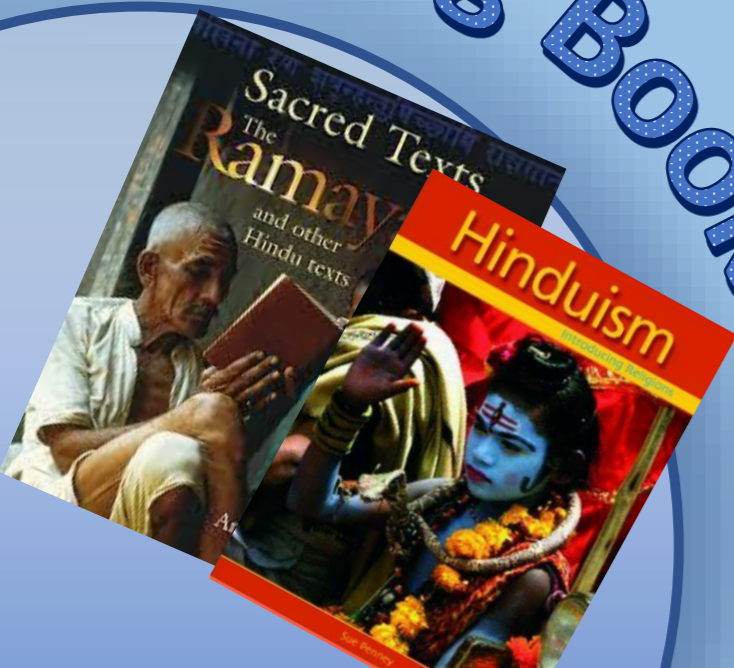

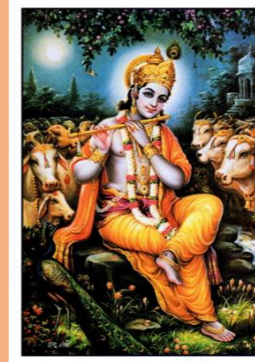
Concepts

Krishna is a major deity in Hinduism, revered as the eighth avatar of Vishnu and as a supreme god in his own right. He is the god of compassion, protection, and love and is considered a warrior, hero, teacher, and philosopher.

Atman

A person's soul.

Avatar

The manifestation of a deity in bodily form.

Vishnu

The second deity in the Hindu Trimurti who is the preserver and protector of the universe.

Krishna

The eighth and most important avatar of Vishnu.

Prince Prahlad

A religious boy who worshipped Vishnu instead of his father, the king. His story is celebrated at Holi.

Holi

A festival held in spring to honour Krishna.

Vedas

The sacred texts of Hindu Dharma.
