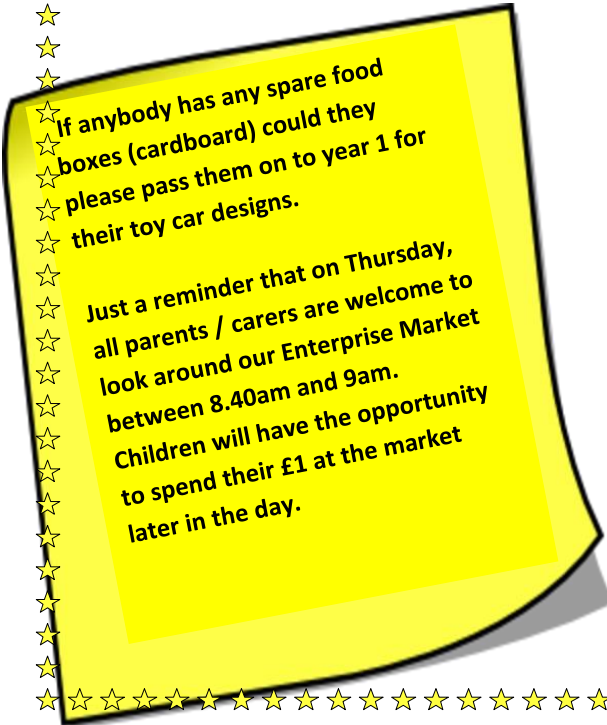
This Week's Highlights

- Year 5 have been looking at irreversible changes in science, we created carbon dioxide from a chemical reaction between baking soda and vinegar!



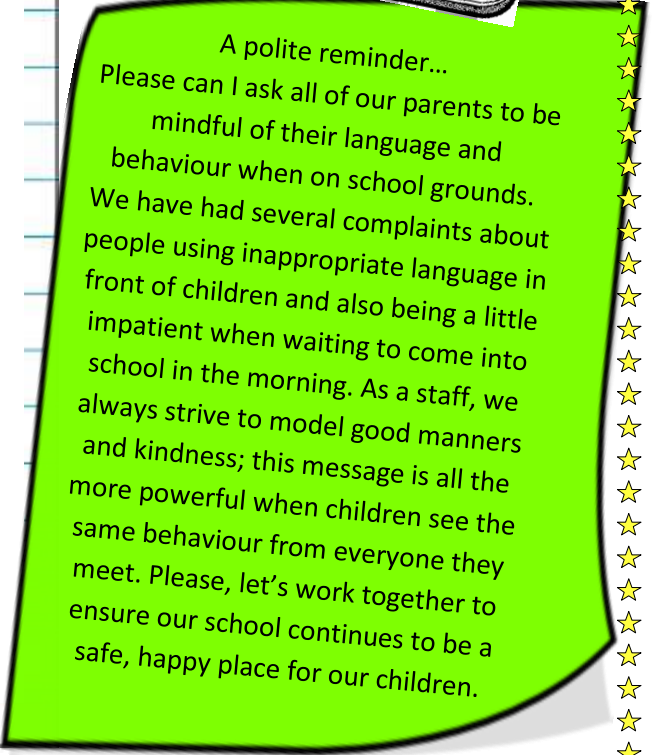
