




- I will show respect and kindness to all my friends and teachers during my video lessons.



Reunited: Come together or cause to come together again after a period of separation or disunity.


Research: The systematic investigation into and study of materials and sources in order to establish facts and reach new conclusions.





Cat fact sheet



- In terms of development, the first year of a cat's life is equal to the first 15 years of a human life.
- Cats can rotate their ears 180 degrees.
- The hearing of the average cat is at least five times keener than that of a human adult.
- In the largest cat breed, the average male weighs approximately 20 pounds.
- Domestic cats spend about 70 percent of the day sleeping. And 15 percent of the day grooming.
- A cat cannot see directly under its nose.
- Most cats have no eyelashes.
- Cats have five toes on each front paw, but only four on the back ones. It's not uncommon, though, for cats to have extra toes. The cat with the most toes known had 32—eight on each paw!
- Some believe that if you dream about a white cat, good luck will follow.
- Meows are not innate cat language—they developed them to communicate with humans!
