
Afterschool Mathe-Whizz Club

Science in Autumn One we will be learning the followings

- -Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of growity acting between the Earth and the falling-object and the impact of gravity on our lives.
- -Identify the effects of air resistance, under resistance and friction, which act between moving surfaces.
- Recognise that same mechanisms, including lowers, pulleys and geors, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect, and that adaptation may lead to evolution



History

Homework


Homework will be given out every MONDAY and should be returned the following MONDAY. Our Homework policy states that Dojos will be awarded for completion or lost for not completing homework.



- Provide parent/carers with relevant information via Dojo and the website. If parents / carers don't have access to the Internet, information will be shared via paper copies on request.



PARENTS / CARERS WILL:

- Ensure children arrive at school on time, dressed in full school uniform that is weather appropriate.
- Collect children on time at the end of the school day.
- Take all steps possible to ensure that children have had a good night's sleep and have eaten breakfast.
- Provide appropriate PE and swimming kit.
- Provide school with information for emergency contact and update this information as necessary.
- Inform school of any changes in circumstances which may influence a child's learning or behaviour.
- Promote the importance of education to your child.
- Have high aspirations for your child.
- Support children with homework and remote learning when necessary.
- Listen to their child/ren read at least 3 times per week.
- Stay connected to Dojo and check for posts and messages regularly.
- Read communication sent from school and respond appropriately
- Be supportive of the school values and promote them at home.
- Support the school's behaviour policy and co-operate fully with any behaviour procedures should they become necessary.
- Follow guidelines outlined in school policies (found on the website).
- Encourage children to respect staff, children and school property.
- Engage positively and respectfully with school staff.
- Act as a good role model for our children whilst on the school site.
- Relay any concerns directly to school.
- Refrain from posting negative comments relating to school on social media.
