Reading

This Week's Highlights

In **Nursery** we have listened to the story "Pete the cat rocking in his school shoes", we compared the areas that Pete the cat has in his school and the areas that the children explore in Nursery. The children talked about what they like to do in the different areas in Nursery. After listening to the song "We're all amazing!" the children considered what makes them amazing.

In **Reception**, we have continued to look at our families and talk about all the different types of families there are. We continued our Art topic of drawing looking at the lines and shapes we can see on Mummy Bear from 'Peace at Last' and drew an observational drawing of her.

In **Year 1** we have been using number lines in Maths. In English, we have enjoyed hearing the Big Bad Wolf's side of the story. He even popped into class to answer our questions! In Geography, we explored our local area and created a map of all the features we spotted.

In **Year 2** we have had lots of fun investigating materials and testing their properties. We have made our own bridges to see which materials are strong / rigid and explored how we can change the shape of materials which are stretchy / flexible. In English we have started reading our new class book 'The Boy who Biked around the World' ready to inspire us about any future adventures we may want to go on!

In **Year 3** we started a new English topic based on 'Orion and the Dark'. We have really enjoyed reading this story and have been writing lots of spooky sentences about it! We have also enjoyed continuing our PE topic all about team games. We have been thinking about tactics and teamwork skills.

In **Year 4** we have been working hard using our number knowledge in Maths to round numbers to their nearest 10 and 100. We have also enjoyed extending our knowledge of the magnificent Maya civilisation in both our history and guided reading lessons this week!

In **Year 5** this week we have continued to secure our knowledge in rounding to 10,100 and 1000. We have been learning about digital systems including inputs, output and processors in ICT. In Science, we have planned our investigation for next week were we will be making our own parachutes.

Year 6 have delved further into the story of War Horse, looking at different characters in depth. In Art, we have been practising our observational skills by sketching our self portraits using lines of guidance to help us and we have started working on calculation in Maths.




