This Week's Highlights

In **Nursery** we have looked at some artwork by Guiseppe Arcimboldo, he used fruit and vegetables to create portraits. The children have also developed their physical skills for writing by taking part in "flipper flapper" dancing. They also then helped our character "Scribble" to draw lines to hold his balloon.

In **Reception**, we have been learning about the traditions and celebration of Diwali. Through stories, videos and resources, children have experienced how some people celebrate Diwali. We have made rangoli patterns, salt dough Diya lamps, Diwali cards and tasted traditional Diwali foods. We ended the week celebrating Children In Need and we reflected on how children should be treated.

In **Year 1** we have been finding addition and subtraction fact families. In English, we have been exploring settings in stories to help us when we write our story. In History, we have created our own family timelines and have enjoyed gymnastics.

In **Year 2** we have been working really hard on adding and subtracting across a ten! The children have been using their resilience to really work through this completely new method of adding and subtracting. In English we have enjoyed starting a new topic on the book paper planes and loved how it linked to our new history topic all about the history of flight.

In **Year 3** we have started a new science topic all about forces and magnets. This week we have been identifying some of the forces at work all around us, every day. In Design Technology, we have been researching magnetic toys, ready to begin work on designing our own!

In **Year 4** we have been reminding ourselves of our previous learning about the continents and oceans of the world and learning all about the dangers of Electricity in Science. The children have worked very hard to write their own letters in role as a WW1 soldier in the trenches and developed some new Maths skills learning all about measuring area.

In **Year 5**, we have really enjoyed reading Private Peaceful and finding out about the characters relationships and how they change throughout the text. In science, we have also recapped on previous learning about air resistance and enjoyed our experiment on water resistance. On Wednesday, we had a visit to St. Peter's church and found out about the story of Adam and Eve, forgiveness, and the Lord's Prayer.

Year 6: In science, we have been learning about our blood, what it consists of and what the job of each part is. We all think our body is amazing! In history, we have been learning about appeasement and how it was used in World War 2. In maths, we have been practising long and short division and in English, we have been writing persuasive letters. It's been a very busy week!

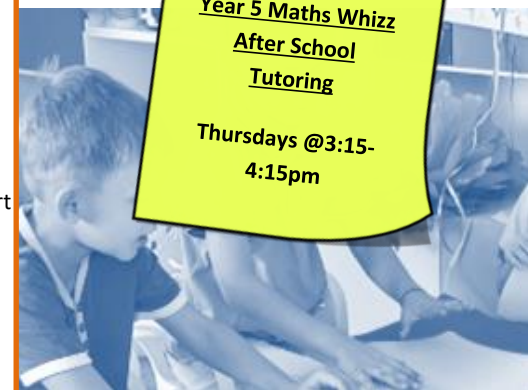
Reminders

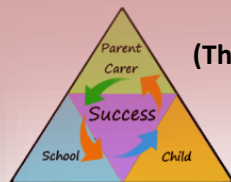
